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The Fulbright Program

Established by legislation introduced in 1946 by Senator J. William Fulbright, the Fulbright Program has the broad purpose of increasing "mutual understanding between the people of the United States and the people of other countries." Congressionally funded, the Program includes awards for teachers, students, and post-graduate scholars, primarily for advanced research, university teaching, and graduate study.

Awards are made each year to students, scholars, and professionals coming to the United States from countries all over the world, as well as to Americans going overseas. The program is supervised by the presidentially appointed Board of Foreign Scholarships, which establishes general policies and selects all participating individuals and institutions.

The Fulbright Program is funded and administered by the United States Information Agency (USIA). The Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES), which is affiliated with the American Council on Education, is responsible for administering the Scholar Program, which awards grants for post-doctoral research and university lecturing.

The Directory

The *Directory of Visiting Fulbright Scholars* is published each year in October. Volume I of the 1983-84 Directory lists more than 800 visiting scholars from 86 countries who have been awarded Fulbright grants and grant extensions for university lecturing and advanced research in the United States during 1983-84. The Directory is prepared for use by interested American scholars, educational institutions, community and professional organizations, and the visiting scholars themselves.

This second volume lists 262 scholars who have been awarded grants or have submitted occasional lecture topics since the publication of the Directory and prior to December 23, 1983. Like Volume I, it is arranged by academic discipline. Copies of both directories are available upon request.

The Occasional Lecturer Program

Established in 1973, the Occasional Lecturer Program assists colleges and universities in arranging for Fulbright Scholars to appear as guest lecturers. While Visiting Fulbright Scholars usually are affiliated with one particular institution, many welcome opportunities to visit other campuses to become better acquainted with higher education in the United States and to exchange ideas with American colleagues. Many scholars are pleased to accept invitations to lecture either in their special fields or on general topics related to the history and culture of their home countries.

The scholars whose names are marked by an asterisk have expressed particular interest in participating in the Occasional Lecturer Program. Topics of special interest to them are listed beneath their names and marked with asterisks. In addition, some scholars who did not indicate particular interest in the lecturing program might nevertheless be pleased to accept invitations; thus invitations to all visiting scholars are encouraged.

Institutions or individuals may contact scholars directly or make contacts through CIES. Limited funds are available, primarily for assistance with travel expenses.

How To Use the Occasional Lecturer Program

Invitations to Scholars

Representatives of institutions or of campus organizations or academic groups are invited to contact scholars directly to arrange visits for occasional lectures, seminars, or special programs. A visitor should be offered travel and maintenance expenses and, when possible, an honorarium. If assistance from the Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES) is desired, the institution should do the following, well in advance:

- determine the field of desired specialization;
- select a geographical area or specific scholar;
- suggest appropriate dates;
- agree upon a local coordinator to communicate with CIES, and to communicate with the invited scholar after CIES has completed initial arrangements.

Arrangements for the Visit

When the Council has confirmed general arrangements for a lecturer, the host institution should then communicate directly with the lecturer regarding a detailed schedule and specific arrangements for the visit. Copies of all correspondence with the lecturer should be sent to CIES.

The host institution should develop a comprehensive plan for using the visiting lecturer. To provide the best use of time and talent for classroom, seminar, and lecturing purposes, a program of two to three days is suggested so that the visitor may become acquainted with the educational program and the academic life of the host institution, both its students and faculty. A longer period is needed if the visit will include several member institutions of a consortium.

The visit should be announced well in advance through faculty bulletins, college and community papers, radio, television, and other channels of communication.

Financial Arrangements

Limited funds are available through CIES to help pay for visits of Fulbright Scholars, particularly to colleges and universities which have had little opportunity to participate in educational exchange. The CIES contribution is usually limited to travel costs. It is expected that most institutions can provide local transportation, accommodations, and meals.

Whether or not CIES provides part of the financial costs, it is important that the host institution and lecturer agree in advance on all financial considerations regarding the visit, to arrive at a clear understanding of who will be responsible for various costs.

Awards for Visiting Scholars

Each year about 800 scholars from abroad are awarded Fulbright grants for lecturing and postdoctoral research at colleges, universities, and research institutions in the United States. Scholars' affiliations in the United States are arranged or confirmed by CIES, which also administers the grants for individuals. Members of CIES are appointed by the member councils of the Conference Board of Associated Research Councils: the American Council of Learned Societies, the American Council on Education, the National Academy of Sciences, and the Social Science Research Council.

Nature of Grants

A Fulbright award provides international travel for the grantee to and from the host institution in the United States, as well as health insurance. For the majority of scholars, financial support while in the United States comes from private foundations, home institutions or governments, binational Fulbright commissions, and personal funds. The host institution also makes important contributions, by waiving academic fees and providing space, research support, and association with professional colleagues.

Grants are usually awarded for a period of three to twelve months but may be extended for limited periods. A few awards are made for less than three months, but not for the principal purpose of attending conferences. Most grants are for research. They may provide either full or partial maintenance. Sixty percent are solely for travel, in cases where the scholar has arranged an appointment with a specific institution.

Scholars who are interested in Fulbright awards for lecturing or research in the United States should apply through their home countries. Within each country the Fulbright Program is administered by either a binational Fulbright commission or the U.S. embassy. Upon request CIES will provide prospective applicants with the name and address of the agency to contact in their particular country.

The applicant must be a citizen or permanent resident of the country where the application is filed; must have a doctorate or its equivalent in professional training or experience; and must submit an acceptable research or teaching proposal to be carried out in a U.S. university or research center approved by the Board of Foreign Scholarships. Scholars from non-English-speaking countries are required to provide evidence of sufficient knowledge of English to carry out the proposed lecturing or research program. Preference is usually given to those without recent experience in the United States.

Scholars-in-Residence

Approximately 100 partial maintenance awards are available annually for lecturers to participate in Scholar-in-Residence programs proposed by U.S. colleges and universities. Proposals are accepted for scholars from all geographic areas. Under this program, a U.S. college or university, a group of institutions, or a consortium may request a Scholar-in-Residence to teach or serve as a resource person in one or more departments or in an international or area studies program. An announcement giving information on the program is issued each summer. Specific scholars may be named by the host institution, or CIES and Fulbright agencies abroad will nominate candidates for consideration. Host institutions provide supplemental funding.
